

What's Happening in Miss Patti and Miss Johanna's Class

L Week



November 5 -9, 2018

Group Time: The children will learn the l sound. They will play "What am I?" as they identify words/pictures beginning with this sound. The students will practice writing L and l in the air and on the carpet with their magic fingers. The boys and girls will learn about their state through maps and books. Also, the children will sing, "This Little Light of Mine." They will sequence the events in a story and relate sequencing to real life events.

Writing: The children will learn the proper starting positions to use when writing L and l. Also, they will use mirrors to observe their mouths (open, shut, tongue placement, etc.) when making the l sound. They will trace and cut "L" templates throughout the week.

Scribble Art: The children will draw lions.

Art: The boys and girls will cover the letters L and l with Louisiana shapes. Also, they will create a Louisiana picture and work on special cards for their grandparents.

Building, Games, and Dramatic Play: Laundry (washing, drying, and ironing), large legos, Lincoln logs, Nabi board, leaf exploration, balance scale, and play doh with "L" cookie cutters are among center activities.

Science: The class will learn more about fall leaves and explore light and heavy with a balance scale.

Religion: The children will be reminded that we give thanks to God for our many blessings and that Jesus is the light of the world. Also, each child has his own special light to shine. The boys and girls will listen to the story of the lost sheep.

Math: Number of the Week - 11

Math Work Jobs continue. Working with ordinal numbers (first, second, third...) is continued. The class will count with songs and calendar, count the number of students who are present each day, and count the number of days until Thanksgiving. They will continue to work on number recognition, order, and one-to-one correspondence.

Alphabet: The children will complete puzzles and/or folder games. They will work on sound activities and visual discrimination with letters Aa - Ll.

What you can do at home: Find L's and l's in books and on signs. Find pictures and/or objects beginning with this sound. Count to 50. Practice learning house/street address. Locate your house number. Read it each day as you come home from school. Locate Louisiana on a United States map.
